They aim to support the relevance, accessibility, and responsiveness of VET institutions and systems as a driver of sustainable socio-economic development




Objectives





- ✓ Reinforce the **links between the VET system** of the Third countries not associated to the Programme **and its labour market**
- ✓ Increase the link between VET profiles and local/regional/national strategies and priorities impacted by skills
- ✓ Increase the capacities of VET providers
- ✓ Support the exposure of staff, managers, policy makers and senior teachers to approaches bringing the labour market and VET closer
- ✓ Improve the knowledge, technical, managerial and pedagogical skills of VET teachers and trainers
- ✓ Integrate the input from teachers/trainers, VET learners and employers into curriculum, profile design and training reform
- ✓ Improve the level of competences, skills and employability potential of VET learners by **developing** new and innovative VET education programmes
- √ Foster cooperation across different regions of the world through joint initiatives

Any public or private
organisation active in VET and legally established in a Programme country

Who can participate?






Any public or private VET provider or organisation active in VET or in the labour market and legally established in a Programme country or in an eligible Third country not associated to the Programme can be involved as full partner, affiliated entity or associated partner

Any public or private organisation contributing to the implementation of specific project tasks/activities or support the dissemination and sustainability of the project can be involved as associated partner







Number and Profile of Participating Organizations



The partnership must include at least 4 full partners from a minimum of 3 countries:

At least 1 organisation from 2 different EU Member States and Third countries associated to the Programme and a least 2 organisations from at least 1 eligible Third country not associated to the Programme

The number of organisations from EU Member States and Third countries associated to the Programme may not be higher than the number of organisations from Third countries not associated to the Programme







Activities




Project activities must focus on building and strengthening the capacities of organisations active in the field of VET principally in the Third countries not associated to the Programme

Funded projects will be able to integrate a wide range of cooperation, exchange, communication and other activities including for example:

- ✓ Creating and developing networks and exchanges of good practice
- ✓ Creating tools, programmes and other materials to build capacity
- ✓ Creating mechanisms to involve the private sector both in the design and delivery of curricula and to provide VET learners with high quality work-based experience
- ✓ Developing and transferring pedagogical approaches, teaching and training materials and methods
- ✓ Developing and implementing international (virtual) exchange activities for staff

Duration: 1, 2 or 3 years






Setting up a project

- ✓ Common values, civic engagement and participation








Award criteria

MINIMUM TOTAL SCORE 60 POINTS		




