Course description (According to the University Catalogue)

This course systematically teaches the history of the development of ancient Chinese literature, introduces the general situation of literary development in various historical periods, the development and evolution of different literary genres, and the creative achievements of important writers, so that students can clearly grasp the origin and law of the development of ancient Chinese literature.

Course objectives:

To enable students to

- 1. understand the basic situation of the ancient Chinese anthology, literary schools and literary creation.
- 2. develop keen interest in the ancient Chinese literature and certain writers.
- 3. analyze and appreciate the ancient Chinese literary works.

Teaching methods:

This course is mainly involved in classroom lectures, practice in class and after class.

- 1. Lecture by teacher
- 2. Class discussion conducted by a student or student committee
- 3. Recitation oral questions by teacher answered orally by students

- 5. Presentations by student panels from the class: class invited to participate

Learning outcomes:

- Knowledge and understanding
 - (1) Ability to master vocabulary through reading and thus express properly in communication.
 - (2) Through intensive training to help students be able to know and master Chinese literature and culture.
- Cognitive skills (thinking and analysis).
 - (1) Learn to recognize beauty and profound connotation of Chinese literature;
 - (2) Learn to logically meditate on ancient Chinese language;
 - (3) Have a basic understanding of the situation of ancient Chinese literature;
 - (4) Learn to explore and form academic interest.
- Communication skills (personal and academic).
 - (1) Introduction of oneself; (2) knowing how to communicate with Chinese on hobbies, costumes, tourists attractions and daily lifestyles; (3) Telling different food in China and cooking some Chinese food; (4) Learning to discuss different dressing styles in China including ancient China, modern China, different dressing style on different occasions and in different areas; (5) Practicing language usage in role-plays to be ready for traveling or studying in China in the future.
- Transferable Skills.
 - (1) Role-play practices enable students to easily cope with real-time situations in real language context in China or in other Chinese language-related situations; (2) Chinese language, knowledge and background information equip students with the ability to cope with political, economic, cultural, and educational, and tourist situations in China, but also in other southeastern Asian countries and any Arab country where Chinese language or cultural background is involved in real-time situations; (3) Cognitive and communication skills help students to deal with any problem-solving situations other than China or Chinese language-related contexts.
- Psychomotor Skills (When applicable)
 - (1) Real-life situations get students familiar with Chinese life styles with the aim of broadening students' horizon and enriches their minds; (2)Reading literary works can cultivate students' quality and improve their aesthetic ability.
